The Process - Analytics

We will break down the analytical side of prospect scouting using predictive metrics and other KPIs through regression analysis to tell a tale with an unbiased point of view. Hitting these thresholds have proven to be predictive through historical data.

For running backs, wide receivers and tight ends these metrics are then fed into a data model that compiles them into a singular score. The higher the score, the more likely that player is to achieve fantasy success in the future.

The quarterback position has far too much nuance to simply be fed into an analytical model. As such we will identify whether each prospect met the thresholds to be considered elite or not.

A pulseless improviser with elite pocket presence and natural playmaking ability. He has great arm talent with the ability to layer throws over linebackers and is very accurate at all levels of the field. He can distribute from multiple arm angles, even when forced to do so off-platform. His biggest knock is that he is a bit of a risk-taker and gunslinger that has a tendency to play hero-ball to make up for missed post-snap progressions. When escaping the pocket and extending plays, he can be careless with the football, which led to eight fumbles in 2024 alone.

Elic Ayomanor is one of the most physical receivers in this year's class. His athleticism at the catch point is elite, and he displays impressive body control and strong hands in congested areas. Elic relies on his physicality to create yards after the catch, but rarely is seen juking a defender for a big gain.

While Elic has excellent long speed, his short-area quickness is lacking, and I don't see much burst or acceleration off the line or in his breaks. Elic tends to round off his routes and often has trouble separating from defenders. If he can improve in these technical areas, he has the size, strength, and athleticism to succeed at the NFL level.

A densely built back with a strong running style. He has good vision and quick feet at the line of scrimmage with elite contact balance. Once at the second level, he is extremely elusive with breakaway speed that leads to frequent explosive runs. He reaches top speed quickly through the line of scrimmage, but lacks a definitive extra gear. He also is a capable pass-catcher, but was never really asked to use this skill much in college. He needs some refinement in pass-protection and blitz pick-up.
